Dear Parents, Guardians, & Care Providers,

In compliance with the Order Of The Health Officer of The County of Riverside dated March 13,2020, Oak Grove Center (Jack Weaver School & Oak Grove At The Ranch) closed our school campuses effective 03/16/20 through 04/03/20. As this is a changing situation, we will be monitoring the situation closely and will comply with any recommendations / mandates regarding the reopening of the school programs. A reopen date has not been determined at this time.

We are working closely with our Districts / SELPAs during this time. We anticipate that we will be receiving more information related to distant learning opportunities / services for our Special Education Students on or about 03/17/20. Once this information is received, we will determine the best way to provide appropriate learning opportunities and services to our students during this closure as deemed appropriate.

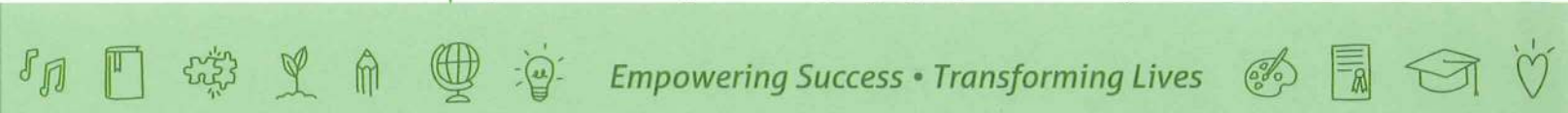
We understand that this closure causes concern for our students and families. Many Districts will be providing meal options in their counties if you are in need of accessing this resource. Information can typically be found on the District webpage if you are able to access the internet. Please call Oak Grove Center (951) 677-5599 if your family is struggling during this time so that we may provide support and / or direct you to appropriate resources that may be available in your area.

Our Short Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP) **will remain open** in order to continue providing necessary Residential and Mental Health Services for our residentially placed students. We assure you, we will continue to provide for needs related to health as well as mental health and emotional well-being. We recommend that our Residential Students continue to receive these services. Any placement decisions will need to be discussed by the IEP team. If you have any questions related to this, please contact your student's individual Therapist / Case Manager, Clinical Director or the Education Department.

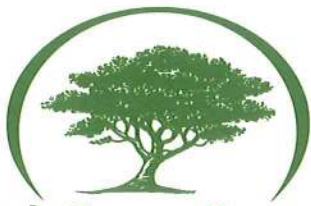
During this closure, the STRTP will be on a structured break schedule with enhanced enrichment activities. We are limiting off campus activities and outings. We are providing outside recreation activities as well as use of the gym and other outdoor experiences that are limited to our youth versus blending with others from the community.

As the situation has now become even more severe in our communities, we have closed the campus to any non-essential visitors. We ask that you support us in having contact with your child through phone calls and video conference that can be arranged through the Therapist. Passes will not be authorized during this time as it leads to greater exposure of other youth and staff upon the return. It is possible for a healthy individual to be the carrier and end up exposing others so guidelines from the Public Health Department and Governor will continue to be followed.

On campus, we have implemented daily temperature checks of both staff and Residents. Our main focus during this time is ensuring that the youth we serve stay healthy. Staff will have temperature checks upon arriving to work prior to entering the dorms. Should staff or essential visitors have any symptoms of being sick, they will be sent home. We continue to follow recommendations from the CDC as well as the Public Health Department and CDSS. Precautions around social distancing, frequent hand washing and avoiding larger groups have been implemented.



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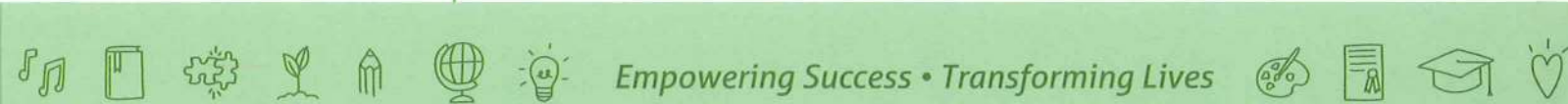
